





DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY NO 04- 3

**AUTHORITY TO SIGN CORRESPONDENCE
UNDER THE AUTHORITY LINE
"FOR THE COMMANDER"**

1. I hereby authorize the following individuals to sign correspondence for me using the authority line "FOR THE COMMANDER"
 - a. Commanding General (CG), U.S. Army Joint Munitions Command (JMC).
 - b. Deputy Commanders (DC), U.S. Army Field Support Command (AFSC) and JMC.
 - c. Chief of Staff (CofS), AFSC (will maintain a reading file of all correspondence signed "FOR THE COMMANDER").
2. This authority is issued *without power of redelegation* and will be exercised in strict accordance with the following: on correspondence containing policy matters, command decisions, official recommendations, or tasking actions addressed to higher headquarters (HQ), other major subordinate commands (MSCs), and/or other Services. Other than myself, only the CG JMC, DCs, and CoS may sign nonconcurrences and AFSC/JMC positions to higher HQ, and disapproval memorandums to subordinate commanders.
3. The authority line "FOR THE COMMANDER" will not be used on memorandums of appreciation/commendation and/or for my signature, nor on documents requiring Head of Contracting Activity signature which requires a specific delegation of authority.
4. The authority line "FOR THE COMMANDER" is often used unnecessarily. It should only be used when an authorized individual signs correspondence for the commander *AND* when paragraph 2 applies. Authorized individuals sign correspondence with the authority line to indicate that it expresses the will of the commander. Action officers may continue communicating with other action officers at higher HQ and other MSCs, only signing for themselves and not the commander.
